

Tangibly Defining Love

In today's Gospel lesson, Jesus tells us, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." Jesus also says, "I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last..."

We live in a culture of superlatives. "Nice" and "good" are stated as "awesome" and "amazing". Sadly, when we need to describe something that is truly awe-inspiring and causes amazement, we no longer have adequate words to do so, since we have diluted down the meaning of those words. Likewise, if something is appealing, people say they "love it". "I love chocolate cake". "I love that dress." In using the word "love" as a superlative, it loses its value and meaning. How sad. "Love" is a wonderful word that genuinely has rich meaning.

Bible scholars speak of three words for love; eros (romantic love), phileo (brotherly love), and agape (God-like love). Other than to mention these, I will say nothing more. Instead, I will speak of more tangible things.


Jesus says, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." Here, Jesus is telling us that love is sacrificial. That is truly the best, down-to-earth explanation of what love is. Love is sacrificial. To love someone is to consciously put their needs ahead of our own. It means that we give up something valuable to accommodate another person or persons. It implies that we will give of ourselves to help someone else. Give what? Whatever is needed. Our sincere interest and attention. Our money or resources. talents. Our time. These are gifts of our selves and our lives. To wholeheartedly give our time and attention to someone else is to give them a part of our life. That is an important gift. We can never get that time back. To give it freely is a sacrifice; it is an expression of love.

Jesus calls us friends, and He calls us to love one another, as He has loved us. His love was expressed through ultimate sacrifice; His very life. His call to us is just as intense, but He is not calling us to die for each other. Instead, He calls us to live our lives as a living sacrifice to Him, expressed through our love and sacrifice for each other. "Love one another." Jesus tells us that in answering this call to love one another, intentionally and sacrificially, we fulfill all of the commandments, and we extend the grace of God to the world around us.

Are we willing to die for Jesus? Many have. Here's a more important question: Are we ready to live for Jesus? Are we ready to love for Jesus?

"Love one another."
