

Transforming Touch

His name is Bill. He came to the ER early one morning by ambulance, quite ill. Fever, chills, fatigue, short of breath. Yes, he had Covid. He had been ill for several days, and he was unable to care for himself at home. As we were settling him in, gathering data and doing necessary interventions, Bill said, "I am all alone. My wife died 5 months ago." Much of the rest of what he said was rather disjointed; Bill seemed to be a bit confused. The one thing that was very clear, however, was the statement, "I am all alone. My wife died 5 months ago.' Bill said this three times in the first 5 minutes of being there. By the time we were done drawing labs and tucking him in, it was change-of-shift.

Twelve hours later, our team was back on duty. Shortly after our arrival, the call-bell for room 15 rang. I responded to it. It was Bill. He was still in the ER because there were no beds available in-house. Though it was the same man from twelve hours prior, he was not in the condition that we had left him. He was still very ill, but his demeanor was completely different. No longer withdrawn and confused, Bill was bright, alert, and interactive. He was actually quite jovial, telling jokes and wise-cracking. Bill was truly transformed in the course of a few hours.

So what was the difference? What had changed Bill from withdrawn and depressed to outgoing and jovial? Human contact. To be in the presence of others. To have encounters with kind, caring people. To be touched. To not be alone.

It is not good for us to be alone. In Genesis, God said just that, and He created a companion for Adam. Jesus took comfort in His friends, the disciples. He sent them out in pairs, so that they could encourage one another er. The early Church gathered together in homes to fellowship, to worship, and to encourage one another. And we gather together today, for the same reasons.

We need God in our lives, every day. His power transforms our lives, freeing us from sin and granting us eternal communion with Him. We also need our fellow human beings. They are a comfort, an encouragement, and, at times, angels.....messengers of grace. The company and touch of a caring person can transform our spirit from despair to hope.
