Calling (from the archives)

Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come."—Mark 1:38

For when I preach the gospel, I cannot boast, since I am compelled to preach. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! If I preach voluntarily, I have a reward; if not voluntarily, I am simply discharging the trust committed to me. -- 1 Corinthians 9:16-18

Jesus said, regarding preaching the Gospel, "That is why I have come." Paul said, "I am compelled to preach....Woe to me if I do not preach". Spreading the Gospel was their purpose. Jesus came to spread the good news of God, and to cement it with His blood. Paul initially tried to destroy the Church, Jesus had other plans for him. He confronted Paul (then Saul) in a blinding light, then revealed to him that God had plans for him. After necessary preparation, Paul then went to become the greatest missionary the world has ever known. His passion for Christ and the Gospel took him to much of the Roman world, spreading the good news. His letters to the different congregations became a large portion of the New Testament, explaining the beliefs and doctrines of the faith, and correcting mistakes and errors into which the congregations were falling. With Paul's guidance, people throughout the world have come to know Christ, and have been helped along in their faith through his writings, both in his day, and throughout the 2000 years since his ministry. A faithful life has eternal impact.

(Jesus) said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation.—Mark 16:15. This is known as The Great Commission. Here, Jesus is instructing His followers to share His Gospel with everyone. Not just Peter, James, John, and the rest of the remaining disciples. This is addressed to everyone who believes on Christ as their Savior. People of every century, right up to this moment. People in every place in the world, including those of us at St. Luke Lutheran Church in Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania. ALL believers, in ALL times, in ALL places. There is NO EXPIRATION on this commission. ALL are called. ALL are expected to serve.

Wow! Intimidated? Don't be. We are in this together. Don't feel capable? Let go of that. Jesus called fishermen and tax collectors to become His disciples, and they certainly were not ready to be ministers when they were called. What's this "called" thing? Well, it is an appointing. We do not apply to God to become His workers. He calls us to do His work; ALL of us. Don't feel prepared to be God's messenger? When we start, none of us are. That's ok. God does not call the empowered; He empowers the called. He will give you the ability to be His messenger; His minister; His worker. If necessary, He will give you the right words to say. After all, the best witness is a silent example, not a plethora of words. Not prepared? Don't know where to start? Easily addressed. Pray. Read your Bible. Participate in worship. Read good Christian writings. Preaching the Gospel, leading us, teaching us, and equipping us to God's service is His role; His calling.

A final note: God will use you right where you are. That is where it starts. The rest will come in time, as He prepares you. Every step may involve trepidation on your part, but it will also include huge blessing from God.
