The Healer

Jon is an 84-year-old gentleman. A retired civil engineer. Tall and lanky of frame. A quiet, gentle personality; a man who smiles warmly in greeting and gratitude. Jon is a resident of an assisted living center, as his Parkinson's Disease has progressed to the point that he is too stiff to do many simple tasks for himself. His mind is still sharp and his thoughts clear, as his conversations make witness, but his body no longer responds as it should. Normally, he can walk with the use of a walker and the help of another person. He can usually feed himself, though it takes a long time; his food is often cold before he can finish it. Dressing independently is beyond him; his rigidity and decreased coordination make that impossible. And so, this once very capable man is now dependent on the help of others. One would think that would make him frustrated and bitter, yet I did not detect anything like that in Jon. I only saw peacefulness and gratitude. The night I encountered Jon, he was in the ER because he was very weakened from an intestinal infection and the results there-of. His illness left him even more dependent than usual. It also stripped away even more dignity, as he required frequent hygiene. Despite this, Jon still smiled.

Leah is a young ER nurse. She only works per-diem, as she is going to school to become a nurse practitioner. She is very smart, quickwitted, and rather funny. She is quite pretty, and has a sassy confidence for all to see. She is a person who has everything going her way. The night I encountered Jon was only the second time that I had worked with Leah. Jon was one of the patients in her assignment. Leah asked for help to clean and reposition Jon.

When I got to Jon's room, I had the opportunity to witness greatness of spirit. Jon needed personal hygiene again. He offered apologies and gratitude, and he smiled gently. Leah was amazing. Gone was the sass and swagger. Instead, she was calm and soothing, speaking to Jon with respect and gentle kindness. Every bit of the care that she delivered was with the same devotion you would see someone give to their dearest loved-one. With sensitivity to Jon's situation, Leah did everything to bolster his dignity. Jon asked if there was any music to listen to, so Leah got her I-phone and found the piece that he wanted. At his request, she played it on a continuous loop for him (she left her phone with him for the duration of the shift). Together, we cleaned him and put him in a more comfortable bed. Leah then turned down the lights, and with words of reassurance that she would be back soon, we left the room. We would be back in there several more times before the end of our shift, and I always witnessed the same gentle kindness.

Jesus tells us to love one another. He taught us about humility by washing the feet of His disciples. He teaches us to honor the dignity of all people as he healed the sick, interacted with those considered "unclean", and raised up women and children as equal and beloved in God's sight. We are surrounded by those who need us to mirror Jesus in these things. How glad I am to have witnessed someone, so blessed with ability, take off the human cloak of pride and do just that, ministering to the body, mind, and spirit of a vulnerable person in need of her care. A true healer.
